

## The Declaration of Astana

#### **Human resources for health**

We will create decent work and appropriate compensation for health professionals and other health personnel working at the primary health care level to respond effectively to people's health needs in a multidisciplinary context.

We will strive for the retention and availability of the PHC workforce in rural, remote and less developed areas.

We assert that the international migration of health personnel should not undermine countries', particularly developing countries', ability to meet the health needs of their populations.

We will continue to invest in the education, training, recruitment, development, motivation and retention of the PHC workforce, with an appropriate skill mix.


## **ICN** supports


